BEFORE YOU START



TITLE SLIDE SHOULD BE PROJECTING

- Presentation should be up before audience arrives
- Is The Room Setup? Screen Lighting? Equipment?
- Do You Have A Bottle of Water?
- Do You Need To Pee?



WHERE IS THE PRESENTER?

- Presenter Should Be There & Ready Before Audience
 - If you arrive late, seem unprepared, the audience will be distracted, and will toon out





KROW THE EQUIPMENT YOU WILL USE!

- Most technical issues are due to bad planning
- Practice With Your Equipment





LIMIT ARY DISTRACTIONS

- The Best You Can...
 - Make Sure The Presentation Area Is Not Distracting

HOW TO START?

- Be In The Room, Be Ready, Look Relaxed...
- Turn On Your Mic, Have Your "Clicker", Take A Breath
- Nail Your Opening
 - Really practice your first 2 minutes...
 - ... And your last 2 minutes



INTRODUCE YOURSELF

• Tell The Audience Who You Are

Establish Why You Are An Expert / Or Why They

Should Listen

You Can Site Past Experience,
 Training Or Projects

- Don't Go Overboard.
- Just A Short Introduction





TWO ENGINEERS WALK IN TO A BAR...

- Ice Breakers?
- Should You Open With A Joke Or Funny Story?
 - They work... but be really carful...
- To Have A Joke Or Funny Story Work, It Has To Be Relevant To Your Audience
 - Be aware of any cultural norms or differences
 - If your audience are not sports fans, don't use sports metaphors

QUESTIONS?

- Tell Your Audience How You Want Questions Asked
 - Do you want them at any time?
 - Hold to the end?

Again, Be Ready... Get There Early... Practice



AGAIN... KNOW THE ROOM


Poor Lighting Can Ruin A Presentation





DON'T READ THE SLIDES

- You Audience Can Read...
- But Don't Make Them Read Too Much
- Don't Put Too Many Bullets On A Slide
- Talk To Your Audience
- Be Engaged with Your Audience







HARDS... WHAT DO I DO WITH MY HARDS?



HARDS... WHAT DO I DO WITH MY HARDS?

- Let Them Be Naturally By Your Side
- Be Relaxed
- Don't Put Hands In Pockets
- Try Not To "Talk" Too Much With Your Hands






WALK AROUND SOME...

- If Possible, Move
 Around On the Stage
- Try Not To Get Trapped Behind A Lectern



MAKE EYE CONTACT


- Look Around The Room
- Hold Eye Contact 2-5 Seconds





WATCH YOUR BODY LANGUAGE


- Stand And Move Around Naturally
- Engage The Audience
- Smile
- Show You Are Excited About The Topic
- Invite Questions





MHO IS BELBIN?

- If You Are Going To Site Industry Experts
 - Tell Us Who They Are
 - Why They Are An Expert
- Provide Source or Links





PRESENTING DATA

Be Carful When Presenting Data and Charts

• This is WAY TO SMALL & Is Really Useless...

What is your audience doing?

"Here is a table of roles..."

"You can read them..."

"I'm not going to read them all..."



YES, I HAVE SEEN PRESENTERS ANSWER THEIR PHONES...

- Turn Your Phone OFF!!!
- Ask Audience To Do The Same









FORMATTING AND CONTENT



USING CRAZY FONTS

- YOUREALLY NEED TO MAKE SURE
- That the Fonts you use
- Are appropriate to the Presentation
- OTHERWISE THEY WILL BE REALLY REALLY
- · Distracting



FORT SIZE

- If your font is too small
- Then you will lose the folks in the
- Back of the room
- A good tip is to make sure you know how big the room is going to be, and make sure you can read your slides from the back of the room.
- Also you should not have bullet points that are too long



FORT SIZE

- Typical font side is 36 point ← this is 36 point in Calibri
- A small font will lose the back of the room
- ProTip:
 - Can you read your slides from the back of the room?
 - If not, Make the font larger
- This takes planning.
 - Know your environment
 - Know the equipment you will have



TO ANIMATE OR NOT?

- Don't have text "fly" in
- Don't Float
- Don't Wipe
- Don't Rotate
- Don't Flow, Wheel
- Conservative is better Fade is a good option



- But don't glow/turn
- Pulse
- •spin...
- there really is not a place for that in a professional presentation.
